Tuesday, April 3, 2018

The Gulf County School Board met in regular session Tuesday, April 3, 2018, at 9:30 (Workshop) and 10:00 (School Board Meeting) at their Administrative Office in Port St. Joe. Superintendent Norton, Attorney Costin, and the following board members were present: Chairman Brooke Wooten, Vice Chairman Cindy Belin, Billy C. Quinn, Jr., Danny Little, and John Wright.

WORKSHOP:

The Board reviewed amendments to the April 3 Agenda Packet, and then discussed Gulf County School Board Policy 5.00/STUDENTS.

BOARD MEETING:	
I.	CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Wooten called the meeting to order at 10:00.
II.	ADOPTION OF AGENDA: On motion by Mr. Wright and seconded by Mr. Quinn the Board unanimously approved the amended agenda to include the addition of pages 2, 4.01, 10, 11-11.05, and 12, and the replacement of pages 1-1.01.
III.	SPECIAL PRESENTATION: (SM: 17/18 – 101) FWC's Biological Scientist Sarah Barrett presented the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's "Black Bear Curriculum," and fielded questions pertaining to the presence of Black Bears in our area and the importance of educating our communities on how to properly deal with Black Bears.
IV.	HEAR FROM THE PUBLIC: Mr. Jason Miller [Wewahitchka Business Owner] expressed the importance of developing strong character traits and skills within our students that would motivate them to set achievable goals and become productive citizens. He stressed that while not every student will choose to attend college, every student can develop employability skills and become successful in our local communities, which is equally important. Mr. Norton asked Mrs. Belin to meet with Jason to address specific areas of concern, and then to tap into each school's current mentoring programs to determine the most effective and feasible approach to reaching out to our students. Mr. Norton and each Board Member thanked Jason for his concern and his efforts to reach our youth.
